The OEMTOOLS® 20 Ton Air Hydraulic Shop Press utilizes an air/hydraulic power system with double speed pump that delivers up to 20 tons of pressing force. The pressing ram head can be operated with either the hydraulic hand pump lever or the pneumatic pump to remove or assemble press fit components.

SPECIFIC SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS AND WARNINGS

Thoroughly read and understand all instructions in this product manual before using this product. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in death, serious personal injury and/or property damage. Like most shop equipment, there is potential danger when operating this press. Accidents are often caused by lack of familiarity or failure to pay attention. Use this press with caution to decrease the risk of operator injury. If normal safety precautions are overlooked or ignored, serious personal injury may occur.

AWARNING:

- 1. DO NOT use a damaged or malfunctioning press.
- 2. DO NOT exceed the rated capacity. Never apply excessive force to a workpiece and always use the pressure gauge to accurately determine the applied load. Exceeding rated press capacity can damage the press, shatter a workpiece, or launch a press pin (causing a severe impact injury). When the press has reached its maximum pressure or the pump lever becomes stiff to operate, the press has reached its limit. Never use a cheater pipe for extra leverage.
- 3. DO NOT stand directly in front of a loaded press and never leave loaded press unattended.
- Applying pressure to parts with this press can cause them to spring out and strike you or bystanders with deadly force. Verify that bystanders are a safe distance away from the press when it is being operated.
- When a part is pressed free, a workpiece may shift suddenly or fall from the press (possibly crushing a foot or leg). Use a catch basket and support long or awkward work pieces with stands or chains.
- NEVER apply pressure to round objects, springs, or elastic items. Applying pressure to unstable objects can cause the object to eject, causing an impact injury.
- 7. Being hit by an ejected workpiece or press tooling can cause severe impact injury or death. When using the press, stand out of the way of any possible projectile path. Never press with rods or pins that are long enough to shift off-center and kick out under a load. Never stack rods and spacers to create an extended press pin. If pressing must occur with an extended press pin, the pin must be fastened with a safety chain or the press pin must be enclosed in a safety cage to eliminate a projectile hazard.
- NEVER use this press to unload spring-loaded assemblies without also using the correct spring caging tool or jig.
- 9. NEVER attempt to re-align a workpiece while it is under pressure. Relieve hydraulic pressure, and start pressing operations over if a workpiece or press pin has moved or become misaligned. If a workpiece becomes misaligned during pressing operations, it may slip out of the press and cause a severe impact injury.
- ALWAYS relieve hydraulic pressure if you suspect the workpiece is in a bind, or structural failure is imminent.
- 11. DO NOT work under the press when it is loaded.

CAUTION:

- Some workpieces cannot withstand the force of pressing and can explode, causing impact injury. Other workpieces have hidden retaining rings, shoulders, pins, and/or welds, or are integral and cannot be pressed apart. Before using this press, make sure you understand how a component is built and pressed apart.
- Use only on a hard, level and flat surface capable of bearing the combined weight of the Shop Press, the operator and any tools being used.

PERSONAL SAFETY

Always wear appropriate safety gear including heavy duty work gloves, ANSI approved safety goggles and steel toe boots during use.

ASSEMBLY

AWARNING: The hydraulic power unit provided with this press is intended to be used as an integral part of this press and not as a stand-alone jacking device separate of the press. Never use the hydraulic power unit provided with this press for any purpose other than that for which it is intended.

Use the parts diagram in this manual as reference for assembly if necessary. Lay all parts and assemblies out in front of you before beginning.

It is advised that you have assistance with standing up and balancing the parts during assembly.

NOTE: DO NOT fully tighten bolts unless instructed to do so at that step of the assembly.

- Use Flat Washer (12), Lock Washer (13), Nut (14), Bolt (27), Flat Washer (20), Lock Washer (21), Nut (22) and Bolt (23) to connect Support Bar (28), Base (19) and Connecting Bar (24) with Post (18).
- With both Upper Beams located back to back, slide the Mounting Plate (5) onto the lower edge of both and carefully assemble to the post using Bolt (7), Flat Washer (9), Lock Washer (10) and Nut (11) to connect Upper Beam (8) to Post. Use caution not to allow the mounting plate to fall free from the upper beams.
- 3. Connect Ram (3), Upper Round Nut (4) and Lower Round Nut (6) to Mounting Plate (5).
- 4. Use Flat Washer (12) and Bolt (29) to connect Pump (30) with Post (18). Then connect the Oil Hose (32) with Ram (3).
- Connect Pressure Gauge (1), Nylon Washer (2) to Ram (3). Tighten the nut to prevent oil leaking. The required tightening force is 20-25 Nm.
- 6. Insert Support Pins (17) into the holes on the Post (18).
- Use Flat Washer (12), Lock Washer (13), Nut (14) and Bolt (25) to connect the 2 Work Beams (16) using the Bushing (26) between them.
- 8. Lower the assembly onto the Support Pins (17). Then, insert Clips (31) into the groove on the Support Pins.
- 9. Tighten all fasteners.





OPERATION

CAUTION: Before each use, inspect the general condition of the Shop Press. Check for oil leaks, press operation, and loose components. If a problem occurs, have the problem corrected before further use.

Before First Use:

- 1. Pour a teaspoon of good quality air tool lubricant into the air supply inlet of the control valve, connect to an air supply and operate for 3 seconds to evenly distribute lubricant.
- 2. Open the pump release valve by using the handle and turning it counter-clockwise. Pump several strokes to eliminate any air from the system. Close valve by turning clockwise once air is properly removed.

Before use, make sure the ram is fully retracted, then loosen the breath nut on the pump and tighten the nut again.

- Set the Support Pins (17) to desired height, and then lower the Work Beam (16). Ensure Work Beam is fully rested on the Support Pins.
- Place Press Blocks (15) on the Work Beam (16) as needed. The Press Blocks must be used as a pair.
- Place workpiece on Press Blocks (15), using every precaution necessary to ensure your safety and prevent workpiece damage. Position workpiece in a manner which will not allow it to inadvertently fall from blocks.
- 4. Close the pump release valve by turning it clockwise.
- 5. Initiate the Ram by depressing the Air Valve and allowing the Ram Saddle to lower until close to the workpiece. Release the air valve stop the ram.
- 6. Align ram and workpiece to ensure center-loading.
- Apply load to workpiece by pumping the handle. DO NOT overload workpiece.

NOTE: DO NOT continue to pump after ram is fully extended.

 Stabilize workpiece in a manner which will not allow it to inadvertently fall from the blocks once the load is removed, then turn release valve counter-clockwise to retract the ram and remove workpiece. DO NOT turn the release valve counter-clockwise more than 1 full turn.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Before each use, inspect press for damage. DO NOT use if bent, broken, cracked, leaking or otherwise damaged components are noted. Periodically, lightly oil all moving parts, including the pump piston and ram. Check ram and pump piston for signs of rust on a regular basis. Clean as needed with a lint free, oil saturated cloth. If press will not be in use for some time, pour a teaspoon of good quality air tool lubricant into the air supply inlet of the control valve, connect to an air supply and operate for 3 seconds to evenly distribute lubricant.

ADDING/CHANGING OIL

NOTE: Premium hydraulic jack oil or equivalent is recommended. Avoid mixing different types of fluid and NEVER use brake fluid, turbine oil, transmission fluid, motor oil or glycerin. Improper fluid can cause premature failure of the ram and the potential for sudden and immediate loss of pressure.

- Remove the Air Venting Screw (P14) on the pump and fill with hydraulic jack oil as necessary.
- 2. Replace the Air Venting Screw.
- 3. Purge air as described in BEFORE FIRST USE above.

TROUBLESHOOTING

AWARNING: Use caution when troubleshooting a malfunctioning press. Stay well clear of the supported load. Completely resolve all problems before use. If the press is malfunctioning, have a qualified technician inspect and repair the press before use.

After the press is repaired: test it carefully without a load by raising it and lowering it fully, checking for proper operation.



At the end of the useful life of the press, dispose of the components according to all local, state, and federal regulations.






PARTS DIAGRAM - ASSEMBLY


